Youth Day Overview

The Vail Soul Music Fest (VSMF) 2011 is proud to offer the VSMF Youth Day Music and Mentoring Program on **August 20, 2011**. Celebrating its second year, Vail Soul Music Fest's Youth Day Music and Mentoring Program creates the space for younger souls to have an enriching soul music experience through interactive, hand-on opportunities.

Youth Day intends to serve 150 multi-cultural and under-served young music enthusiasts who are currently entering the 6th – 9th grades. These middle school students and high school freshmen will travel to Eagle County from the Denver metro area and from neighboring mountain communities where they will participate in music workshops designed to promote **social responsibility, self-esteem** and **cultural awareness**. More than 50 adult mentors and chaperones from various mentoring organizations, businesses and community groups, will support these students. Participants will be selected by May 2011 through an application process. All costs, including transportation and meals, are underwritten by the generous donations of sponsors, foundations and individuals.

Vail Soul Music Fest is more than a music event but rather “the ultimate soul experience.” Education is a key component of Festival as we strive to preserve and celebrate soul music as an art form. During the Music and Mentoring Program, a select group of students will experience the opportunity to collaborate with each other as well as with participating festival artists. Youth will experience music, mentoring and educational forums.

We are seeking nominations by parents and/or sponsors for students who meet the following criteria:

- Entering 6th – 9th grade in Fall 2011*
- Interested in learning about the soul music industry from industry professionals
- Must have nomination form and complete short essay application

At A Glance-Workshop Descriptions

Track 1: History

History A: The Cosmic Music Evolution

Workshop Description: History of Soul Music

Explore African-American music and some of its musical influences like the spiritual sounds of Gospel, soothing sounds of soul, and hip tunes of Jazz and R&B.

History B: How Funky Met Fresh

Workshop Description: History of Hip Hop Music

Take a trip through hip-hop history while exploring the sound, fashion, and culture of the time! Participants will view video clips from films depicting different fashion and style eras in hip-hop history, listen to original sound clips and then hear modern versions that have sampled these timeless pieces, and learn how hip-hop culture influenced society during various decades in U.S. history. Participants will see the transition of fashion, culture and style from the 1950's to the essence of the present-day and learn about other cultural influences on Hip Hop music.

Track 2: Practicum

Free Your Style

Workshop Description: Learning the basics of African hand drums and examining the fundamentals of writing lyrics, poetry, and/or spoken word. Participants will have hands-on lessons in traditional African drumming and will explore the freedom of creativity in writing lyrics, poetry, or spoken word.

Track 3: Self-Esteem

Girls R.O.C.K.! (Real Opportunities for Confidence and Knowledge)

Workshop Description: Self-esteem workshop for girls.

Girls will address issues of self-esteem. By analyzing lyrics of popular Hip Hop and R&B Songs, participants will learn to become responsible consumers of music while illustrating positive forms of self-expression.

My S.W.A.G.! (Self-Worth And Greater Purpose)

Workshop Description: Self esteem workshop for boys.

Boys will address issues of self-esteem. By analyzing lyrics of popular Hip Hop and R&B Songs, participants will learn to become responsible consumers of music while illustrating positive forms of self-expression.
